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The Floating Cinema: On The Bench, 2017

As conveyed by its title, On The Bench plays on the ambiguity that comes with not being directly involved, but instead waiting for the chance to be part of something. Created in collaboration with residents dispersed across the industrial landscape of South and East Yorkshire, this eight episode work features conversations with individuals who are attempting to define or redefine what constitutes culture. Collectively the episodes that form this series touch on a plethora of issues ranging from the dynamics between culture, creativity, identity; the relationship between central and peripheral geographical locations; and the complexity of positioning alternative stories in order to challenge dominant narratives.

Building on Meadley's interest in humour as a device to explore complex issues and spurred on by his own circumstances as an artist contemplating his own trajectory, *On the Bench* is a part biographical part autobiographical work where personal concerns and modes of navigation are highlighted and imagined futures are articulated.

Following the familiar format of web-based interviews by comedians across the world, *On the Bench* will exist as an online series while simultaneously being presented by The Floating Cinema. The Floating Cinema tours to eight different locations from 1st July – 13th August 2017 featuring additional archive footage and independent films that have been selected by local community groups. The tour takes Meadley's new commission *On the Bench* tour as its point of departure and questions who decides and defines culture throughout its presentation.

The programme is supported by Arts Council England, BFI, Film Hub North, Esmee Fairbairn Foundation, Canal & River Trust and forms part of Hull City of Culture 2017.

Marketing

The marketing plan includes local marketing for communities surrounding the Humber and South Yorkshire Navigation locations. A free and lowcost events programme ensures financial accessibility throughout the tour and working with local arts organisations along the route, will aid us in connecting with arts-engaged audiences in each of our locations. As each of Harry Meadley's short films is to be made in the corresponding towns along the route, we anticipate that the communities engaged via this process will also be keen audiences for the event. Support from Sutton PR as well as distribution of a range of print materials to canal-side and community locations will help to connect with diverse communities along the tour.

Accessibility

We are continuously exploring ways of making The Floating Cinema more accessible (including contracting disability arts charity Shape Arts to review our offer). Currently, the vessel is not wheelchair accessible, we have recently installed an induction loop on our boat to help deaf or hard of hearing audiences enjoy our events on board and a handrail has been installed by the stairs to the auditorium to improve access. Harry Meadley's webseries episodes will be subtitled to meet accessibility requirements and will be subtitled in a range of other languages to meet the language needs of prominent communities along the route. Sustainability

The Floating Cinema runs with Hybrid Engine which runs on 100% Bio Fuel – a fully sustainable product. As an Arts Council National Portfolio Organisation, we have made a commitment to ensuring our events are as sustainable as possible. We regularly attend events and follow guidelines from Julie's Bicycle, to manage and reduce our environmental impacts.

Security

Open air screenings will be secured with crowd barriers where deemed necessary, and SIA trained security will be put in place to ensure that the events programme is only available to ticket buyers or free events are restricted to capacities agreed prior to event.

Filming and photography

A number of the events will be filmed and photographed by individuals contracted by UP Projects. The material generated will be used for the UP Projects archives and publicity. For onboard events we ask that audience participants complete a release form, in order to provide permission for their image to be used. At large scale outdoor events where this is not possible, we will have signage to let people know about the possibility of filming and photography and our photographer will be asked to use discretion at all times.

Food and drink suppliers

The Floating Cinema audience members will benefit from food and drink suppliers on site organised by UP Projects. The sales will involve cash and card transactions on site.

Power

The Floating Cinema is able to generate enough power for the Cinema and Cinema infrastructure. At some locations along the route we will also be able to negotiate access to power from on-shore power supplies. The Floating Cinema will provide the appropriate length of cable protection.

Venue Considerations

Local Neighbours And Other Boats: Local businesses will be contacted ahead of the event by the team. Where there are residents directly by the locations at which we will deliver outdoor films screenings, UP Projects will ensure that information has been circulated to communities nearby. Local marketing will be directed to other boaters in the area to let them know of the forthcoming events.

Other Events And Other Boats: We will ensure the boat is in a position which will not obstruct any boat routes or other events.

Weather Contingency: In the event of light rain we will distribute umbrellas. We also erect small marquees at each site, which can be used as shelter if necessary. Blankets are available for hire in case of cold weather, and weather updates will be a key part of marketing information to audiences in lead up to events. In the event of heavy wind and extreme rain outdoor events will be cancelled.

Keeping The Public Walkways Clear: Stewards will ensure audience members do not obstruct tow paths or public right of way. Attendees standing or sitting on the walk path will be asked to move into the Floating Cinema area (within barriers) or move on.

Safety Of Children On Site: Children will not be admitted to any events without the accompaniment of parents or a guardian. If we deem that any child is on site without being accompanied, security will be contacted.
